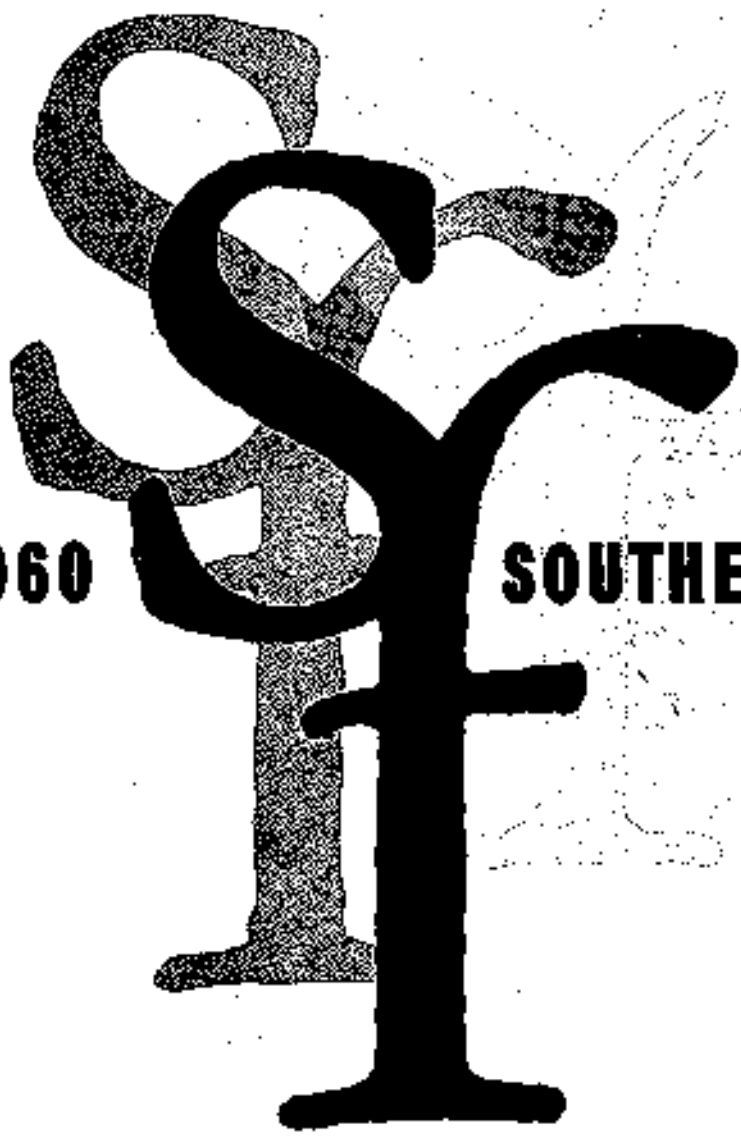

The 1960 Conclave

The University of Georgia initiated the idea of a conclave of Southern Forestry Schools, and was the sponsor of the first conclave. This conclave was held at Camp Rock Eagle, Georgia. The event was a tremendous success and stirred the interest of all participating schools. The University of Georgia donated a rotating trophy that is awarded annually to the school with the highest total score in the conclave events. Georgia, incidentally, won the trophy at the first conclave. The Second Annual Conclave was sponsored by Louisiana State University, and was held at Camp Grant Walker, near Alexandria, Louisiana. Because of the interest aroused the previous year, the competition in the events was very keen. The University of Georgia again captured top honors.

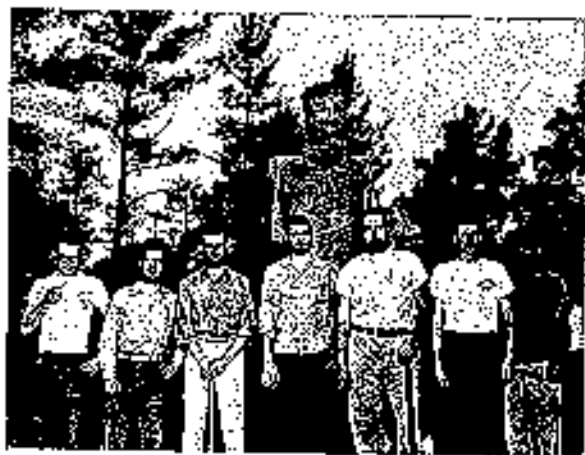
This year, we, the members of the Auburn Forestry Club of Auburn University were proud to be sponsors of the Third Annual Conclave held at the Franklin D. Roosevelt State Park near Pine Mountain, Georgia, April 30-May 1. After months of enthusiastic planning the big weekend finally arrived. We packed our gear and left for Pine Mountain early Friday morning, April 30. Upon arrival at camp, each member proceeded to set up the event for which he was responsible. By noon all preparations were completed and after a brief review of all contest rules, we settled down to await the visitors.

Representatives from ten southern colleges and universities with forestry schools and departments arrived intermittently from 2:30 p. m. Friday until 3:30 a. m. Saturday. Schools represented were: Arkansas

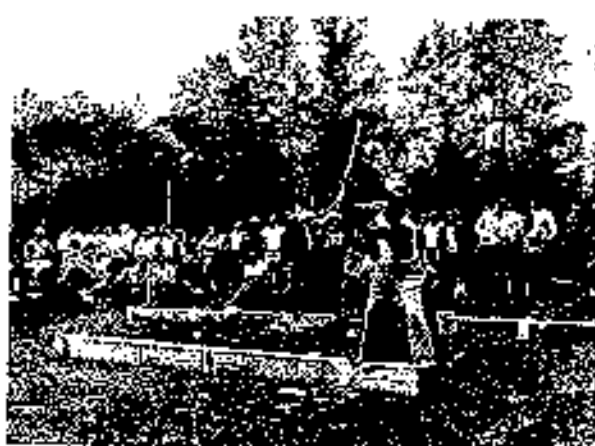
A. & M.; Stephen F. Austin State College, -Texas; North Carolina State; Clemson; University of Georgia; University of the South, Sewanee; Louisiana State University; Mississippi State University; University of Florida; and Oklahoma State University. The Forestry Club from Oklahoma State University was first to arrive; followed closely by the delegation from Stephen F. Austin State College. The foresters from L. S. U. were last to check in, barely arriving in time for breakfast.

At 6:30 a.m., Saturday morning, breakfast was served to kick off an action packed day. Conclave Chairman O'Gara welcomed the delegates to Pine Mountain on behalf of the Auburn Forestry Club. Although the skies threatened rain, the contests were initiated promptly at 8:00 a.m. with the cross-cut sawing contest; followed by axe throwing, log chopping and a variety of other contests. The competition was keener than in the first two conclaves as indicated by the faster times and higher scores. The morning contests were concluded with the Paul Bunyan contest as David Powell of Mississippi State University was declared the "Son of Paul" for the 1960 conclave.

Immediately before and after lunch, interesting exhibits by Forestry Suppliers, Poulan Saw Company, Inc., and Joe H. Brady & Assoc.



were the centers of attraction. Around 1:00 p.m. The events were resumed with the more professional contests such as Dendrology, timber estimation, pole classification, and compass and pacing commanding the most attention from the host of observers and unofficial scorekeepers. Next the waterfront became the center of attraction as the log burling and canoe jousting contests started. The canoe jousting started at 4:30 p.m. as scheduled but turned into a marathon duel and ended--not as scheduled-- about 7:30 p.m.



The banquet- delayed one hour by the canoe jousting-- finally began sometime after 8:00 p.m. Dennis O'Gara, serving as master of ceremonies, introduced R. C. "Bo" Ezell, President of the Auburn Forestry Club. President Ezell expressed his appreciation to members of the conclave committee and members of the Auburn Forestry Club for helping to make the conclave possible.

W. B. DeVall, Forestry Department Head, School of Agriculture, Auburn University, presented prizes to individual contest winners and representatives of winning schools. Roger Dennington received a chain saw and rotating plaque for first place winning Arkansas A. & M.

Dennington is vice-president of the Forestry Club of that school. Bill Beland, President of the Forestry Club, University of Georgia, accepted a little tree injector as second prize for his school. Dick Brake, past vice-president of the Forestry Club at North Carolina State, accepted a tree pruner as third prize for his school.

Speaker at the banquet was Thomas Marshall, a graduate of L. S. U. and representative of the Gulf States Paper Company, Demopolis, Alabama, who spoke on "Futures in Forestry".

The regular business meeting started promptly at 10:00 p.m. with each school selecting a voting delegate. The proposed constitution for the conclave organization was presented by Bill Baggett, Constitution Committee Chairman. A discussion of the proposed constitution followed with a fairly calm atmosphere prevailing until Article VII-Contests- was discussed. After much argument, debate, and behind-the-scenes political maneuvering, a satisfactory compromise was adopted. The constitution was voted on and unanimously passed. As a result, all forestry clubs represented at the meeting are now charter members of the Association of Southern Forestry Clubs.

The O. S. U. and Arkansas A. & M. delegates then offered bids to hold the 1962 Conclave. Arkansas A. & M.'s bid was accepted after their delegate stated that the president of the college offered \$1500 to the club if they held the conclave at their school. The meeting was adjourned until the next annual conclave.

Sunday morning the future foresters were up early making preparations for their return journey to the various forestry schools across the South. First-place winner Arkansas A. & M. left with resounding pig squeals echoing through the park. As the less fortunate schools left,

they were thinking, "Wait till next year and we'll show those razor-backs then."

Regular Business Meeting

Southern Forestry Schools

April 30, 1960

The regular business meeting of the Southern Forestry Schools was called to order by Dennis O'Gara, Conclave Committee Chairman, at 10:00 p.m., on April 30, 1960, at the Third Annual Conclave, held at Franklin D. Roosevelt State Park, near Pine Mountain, Georgia.

Voting delegates were as follows:

A copy of the minutes of the last business meeting was not available.

The proposed constitution for the organization was presented by Bill Baggett, Constitution Committee Chairman.

Charlie Aylin moved to accept the proposed constitution. The motion was seconded and the floor opened for discussion.

In order to speed up the discussion, Chairman O'Gara asked Baggett to take the chair.

A discussion of the proposed constitution, article by article, followed.

Don Estes moved that Article II be amended to include the objective, "to hold an annual conclave." The motion was seconded and passed.

Bill Morse moved that in Article III, Section A, Part 3, the word "senior" be inserted before "university or college." The motion was seconded and passed.

Howard Scheurenbrand moved that in Article III, Section A, Part 1, the words "the South" be substituted for the list of states. The motion was lost for want of a second.

Howard Scheurenbrand moved that in Article III, Section A, Part 1, the words "or higher" be inserted after "Baccalaureate." The motion was seconded and passed.

Larry McKinley moved that in Article III, Section A, Part 1, West Virginia be added to the list of states. The motion was seconded and passed.

Charlie Aylin moved that Article III, Section A, Part 1, be changed to read "granting a baccalaureate degree in forestry, or equivalent, with a major in forestry, or a higher degree in forestry". The motion was seconded and passed.

Larry McKinley moved that in Article III, Section C, Part 1, the word "voting" be struck out, and that all of Part 2 be struck out. The motion was seconded and passed.

The following names were suggested for the organization's annual publication: "The Blue Ox", by the University of the South; "The Rebel Log", by L. S. U.; "The Lumberjack", by Stephen F. Austin; "The Dixie Forester", by the University of Florida; "The Southern Forester", by Clemson. A vote was taken and "The Southern Forester" was selected as the official name.

Roger Dennington moved that in Article IV, Section C, the phrase, "at which time new officers will be elected", be struck out. The motion was seconded and passed.

Bill Morse moved that in Article V, Section B, Part 1, the words, "two years in advance" be added at the end. The motion was seconded and passed.

Blair Meredith moved that in Article V, Section A, Part 1, the words "on the last night of the conclave" be added at the end. The motion was seconded and passed.

Ed Karch moved that in Article V, Section B, Part I, the word "voting" be struck out. The motion was seconded and carried.

Ted Swope moved that in Article VI, the words "represented at the conclave" be struck out. The motion was seconded and carried.

Charlie Aylin moved that Article VII, Section E, be changed to read "Each member and associate member school shall receive one copy for each member of their Forestry Club". The motion was seconded and passed.

In the discussion of Article VIII, Bill Morse passed out copies of a proposed substitution for the entire article.

Bill Morse moved that his proposed substitution for Article VIII be accepted. The motion was seconded but defeated.

Jim Martin moved that in Article VIII, Section B, Parts 1 and 2 be changed to "Pole Classification" and "D. B. H. estimation". The motion was seconded and passed.

Charlie Aylin moved that a ten-minute recess be taken. The motion was seconded and passed.

The meeting was called to order and Jim Martin moved that his amendment of Article VIII, Section B, Parts 1 and 2 be reconsidered. His motion was seconded and passed. It was reconsidered and defeated.

Professor J. R. Parker, of the University of Georgia, speaking for Bill Morse, moved that Article VIII be amended to read as follows:

"Article VIII. Contests.

- A. Competitive events will be held at each Annual Conclave.
- B. There will be 15 standard competitive contests at each Annual

Conclave.

- 1. Standard events

presently enrolled and who have declared an intention of enrolling in the forestry department or school at the beginning of their junior year will also be eligible for participation."

The motion was seconded and passed.

Don Estes moved that Article V, Section B, be amended to include a Part 4, reading as follows: "If a previously elected host notifies the members of the ASFC, by October 1 of the year before it is to hold the conclave, that it cannot hold the conclave, the president shall solicit bids from the members and then send a ballot to each member club to be voted on in writing." The motion was seconded and passed.

A vote was taken and the Constitution was accepted as amended.

Oklahoma State University and Arkansas A. & M. college submitted bids to hold the 1962 conclave. After an explanation by each school of why they wanted to be host to the conclave, a vote was taken and Arkansas A. & M. College was unanimously elected.

Charlie Aylin moved that the University of Florida Forestry Club be appointed as a rules committee to draw up a set of rules for the standard events and send them to all members clubs for their approval. The motion was seconded and passed.

Jim Martin moved that the meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded and passed.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHERN FORESTRY CLUBS

Adopted April 30, 1960 at the Third Annual Conclave

ARTICLE I. Name

The name of this organization shall be the Association of Southern Forestry Clubs.

ARTICLE II. Objectives

- A. To benefit the forestry clubs of the various southern schools by an interchange of ideas and stimulation of good fellowship among the club members.
- B. To establish and maintain:
 1. A unity of purpose and action within and among the southern forestry clubs.
 2. A high standard of professional ethics.
 3. Closer cooperation and relationship between students and professional foresters.
- C. To hold an annual conclave.

ARTICLE III. Membership

A. Qualifications

1. Any Forestry club of a university or college of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, or West Virginia granting a baccalaureate degree in forestry, or equivalent, with a major in forestry, or a higher degree in forestry, shall be eligible for a voting membership in this association upon a majority approval of a petition submitted to the voting member clubs; or be application by representation at the Annual Conclave.
2. Charter members: Louisiana State University, University of Florida, Stephen F. Austin State College, Mississippi State University, Arkansas A. & M. College, University of the South, Auburn University, Oklahoma State University, University of Georgia, North Carolina State College and Clemson Agricultural College.
3. Any Forestry club of a university or college within the states listed in Part I. of this section, not granting a baccalaureate degree in forestry, shall be eligible for associate membership upon a majority approval of a petition submitted to the voting member clubs.

B. Privileges

1. Voting members (each club) are entitled to one vote and full participation in all conclave activities.
2. Associate members are eligible for all rights and privileges except associate members will be denied the right to vote.

C. Dues

1. The annual dues shall be ten dollars for each member club.
2. The dues shall be used to pay for correspondence, publications, and other association expenses of the host club and any excess funds may be used to help defray the expense of the conclave by the host club.
3. The dues for the following year will be paid to the host school for that year between the time of the Annual Conclave and January 1 of the following year.

ARTICLE IV. Officers

A. The officers of the association shall be:

1. President-elected from and by the host club.
2. Vice-president-one elected from and by each member club.
3. Secretary-elected from and by the host club.
4. Treasurer-elected from and by the host club.
5. Editor-elected from and by the host club.

B. Duties of the officers.

1. The duties of the President shall be:
 - a. To preside at all meetings of the association.
 - b. To appoint committees.
 - c. To be responsible for submitting an officers report to the accumulative files upon the completion of the ASFC Conclave.
 - d. To be responsible for obtaining reports from each of his committee and officer heads of the host club.
 - e. To perform all other duties necessary.
2. The duties of the Vice-president shall be:
 - a. To act as representative of his club.
 - b. To notify the president of his election.
 - c. To compile a report of the activities of the association, and be responsible for submitting material to the host club for the annual publication.
 - d. The host club vice-president is to preside in the absence of the president of the association.
 - e. To be responsible for submitting to member clubs publications within his club, and maintaining an accumulative file of ASFC correspondence.
3. The duties of the Secretary shall be:
 - a. To keep the minutes of all meetings of the association and to conduct all correspondence relative to the business of the association.
 - b. To submit an officer's report for the accumulative files, upon completion of the ASFC Conclave.

4. The duties of the Treasurer shall be:
 - a. To receive and have custody of all money paid to the association.
 - b. To keep a careful record of all receipts and expenditures.
 - c. To prepare a financial report for publication in the annual issue of "The Southern Forester".
 - d. To be responsible for the collection of dues.
5. Duties of the editor shall be:
 - a. To gather and edit all material for the annual publication, "The Southern Forester".
 - b. To see that the provisions of Article VII are carried out.

C. Tenure of Office

1. Officers are to hold office until the next Annual Conclave with the exception of the editor, who will serve until the annual publication is distributed.

D. Election of Officers.

1. The President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Editor of the association shall be elected by the host club at their first club meeting following the conclave.
2. Vice-presidents of the association shall be elected by their respective clubs at their first meeting following the conclave.

ARTICLE V.

Meetings

A. Time of meetings.

1. Meetings shall be during the annual spring conclave on the last night of the conclave.
2. The exact time of meetings is to be left to the discretion of the host club.

B. Election of Host Club.

1. The host club shall be selected from bids submitted by member clubs at each annual meeting by a roll call majority vote two years in advance.
2. In case of a tie, the president shall cast the deciding vote.
3. No club shall be host more than once in three years.
4. If a previously elected host notifies the members of the ASFC, by October 1 of the year before it is to hold the conclave, that it cannot hold the conclave, the president shall solicit bids from the members and then send a ballot to each member club to be voted on in writing.

C. Files

1. Accumulative files shall be maintained by the host club and shall include all member reports and correspondence.
2. Each file shall contain a copy of the ASFC constitution.

ARTICLE VI.

Amendments

The constitution may be amended or revised by a two-thirds vote of the voting member clubs.

ARTICLE VII.

Publication

- A. Title. The title of the publication shall be "The Southern Forester".
- B. The constitution shall be published annually in the publication "The Southern Forester".
- C. The past host club shall publish the ASFC periodical within one month after the Annual Conclave.
- D. Securing items for publications.
 1. The articles shall be edited by the member club and submitted to the host club.
 2. Articles to be printed in the current issue must be in the hands of the publishing editor not later than the time of the Annual Conclave.
- E. Distribution.

Each member and associate member school shall receive one copy for each member of their forestry club.
- F. Proceedings of the Conclave.

Proceedings of each Annual Conclave, including minutes of the business meetings, will be published by the past host club in the annual publication.

ARTICLE VII.

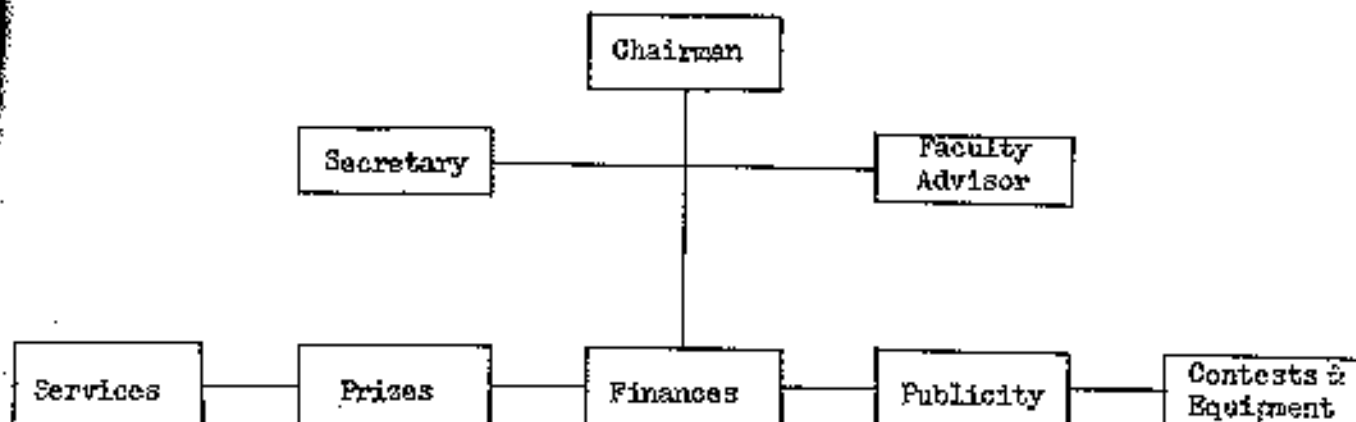
Contests.

- A. Competitive events will be held at each Annual Conclave.
- B. There will be 15 standard competitive contests at each Annual Conclave.
 1. Standard events.

a. dendrology	h. Axe throwing
b. compass and pacing	i. knife throwing
c. timber estimation	j. pole climbing
d. d. b. h. estimation	k. bow sawing
e. pole classification	l. log rolling
f. wood technology	m. cross-cut sawing
g. chain throwing	n. log chopping
	o. bait casting
 2. Scoring of these standard events will be seven (7) points for first place, five (5) points for second place, and three (3) points for third place, for a, b, c, d, e, and f, and five (5) points for first place, three (3) points for second place, and one (1) point for third place for all other events.
- C. In addition to the 15 standard events established in Section B, there may be a maximum of five (5) contests at the discretion of the host club, provided that these contests be specified with rules and explanations at the preceding Annual Conclave. Requests for omission of any standard contests will be made at the preceding Annual Conclave with a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote necessary for approval.

- D. A standard set of rules will be made and approved by the voting member of the ASFC.
- E. Selection of judges of all contests will be left to the discretion of the host club except in the event the host club participates; then judging will not be done by members of the host club.
- F. Only students presently enrolled in a school or department of Forestry will be eligible to enter ASFC events. In the case of the University of Florida and the University of the South, freshman and sophomore students presently enrolled and who have declared an intention of enrolling in the forestry department or school at the beginning of their junior year will also be eligible for participation.
