# CONSTITUTION

## ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHERN FORESTRY CLUBS

### Article I. Name

The name of the organization shall be the Association of Southern Forestry Clubs.

### Article II. Objectives

- To benefit the forestry clubs of the various southern states by the exchange of ideas and stimulation of good forestry among the club members.
- To establish and maintain:
  - Unity of purpose and action within and among the southern forestry clubs.
  - A high standard of professional ethics.
  - Strong cooperation and relationships between student and professional foresters.
- To hold an annual conference.

### Article III. Membership

- Any forestry club of a university or college of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, or West Virginia granting a baccalaureate degree in forestry, or equivalent, with a major or forestry, or a minor degree in forestry, shall be eligible for voting membership in this association upon a majority approval of a petition submitted to the voting member clubs or by application by representation at the annual conference.
- Former members: Southern State University, University of Florida, Stephen F. Austin College, Mississippi State University, Oklahoma State University, University of the South, University of Arkansas at Fayetteville, Auburn University, University of Georgia, North Carolina State College, and Clemson Agricultural College.
- Any Forestry Club of a senior university or college within the states in that 1 of this section not granting a baccalaureate degree in forestry shall be eligible for associate membership upon a majority approval of a petition submitted to the voting member clubs.

### Article IV. Privileges

Members (each club) are entitled to one vote and full participation in all conference activities.

- The annual dues shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) for each member club. (Serving clubs shall pay a reduced rate to be set by the association.)
- The dues shall be used to pay for correspondence, publications, and other association expenses of the host club, and any excess funds shall be divided between the member clubs equally.
- The dues for the year will be paid to the host club by January 1, preceding the conference.

### Article IV. Officers

- The officers of the Association shall be:
  - President - elected from and by the host club.
  - Vice President - one elected from and by each member club.
  - Secretary - elected from and by the host club.
  - Treasurer - elected from and by the host club.
  - Editor - elected from and by the host club.

### Article V. Duties of Officers

- The duties of the officers:
  - The duties of the President shall be:
    - To preside at all meetings of the Association.
    - To appoint committees.
    - To be responsible for submitting an officers' report to the accumulating files upon the completion of the ASFC calendar.
    - To be responsible for obtaining reports from each of the committees and officer heads of the host club.
    - To perform all other duties necessary.
    - The duties of the Vice President shall be:
      - To act as a representative of his club.
      - To notify the President of his election.
      - To complete a report of the activities of the Association and be responsible for submitting materials to the host club for annual publications.
      - To be responsible for submitting member club publications within his club and arranging in appropriate files of ASFC correspondence.
    - The duties of the Secretary shall be:
      - To keep the minutes of all meetings of the Association and to conduct all correspondence relative to the business of the Association.
      - To submit an officers' report for the accumulating files upon completion of the ASFC calendar.
    - The duties of the Treasurer shall be:
      - To receive and have custody of all money paid to the Association.
      - To keep a correct record of all receipts and expenditures.
      - To prepare a financial report for publication in the annual issue of the Southern Forester.
      - To be responsible for the collection of the dues.
    - The duties of the Editor shall be:
      - To edit and edit all material for the annual publications, the Southern Forester.
      - To see that the provisions of Article VII are carried out.
  - Terms of Office  
Officers are to hold office until the next annual conference with one exception of the Editor, who will serve until the publication is distributed.
  - Election of Officers  
The President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Editor of the Association shall be elected by the host club at their first club meeting following the conference.  
Vice Presidents of the Association shall be elected by their respective clubs at their first meeting following the conference.

### Article V. Meetings

- Title of Meetings  
The business meeting will be held on the Friday preceding the ASFC field day.
- In case of an tie, the President shall cast the deciding vote.
- Any club shall be the host more than once in three years.
- It is previously stated that notified the members of the ASFC by October 1 of the year before it is to hold the conference, that it cannot hold the conference, the President shall publicly state from the podium and then send a letter to each member club to be voted on in writing.
- The host club shall be alternated from year to year whenever possible.

- Title  
The officers' files shall be maintained by the host club and shall include all members' reports and correspondence.
- Each file shall contain a copy of the ASFC Constitution.

### Article VI. Amendments

The constitution may be amended or revised by a two-thirds vote of the voting member clubs.

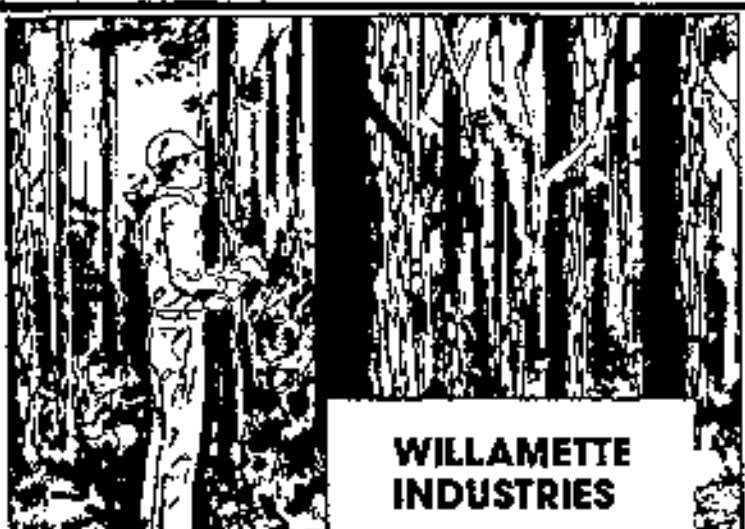
